

**Regulation (EC) No. 1907/2006 concerning the Registration, Evaluation, Authorization and Restriction of Chemicals (in short: "REACH Regulation")**

Dear Sir or Madam

in the sense of the REACH Regulation, Jung Pumpen GmbH as a producer of high-quality pumps, lifting units and pumping stations for the fields of building services, sewage technology and pressure drainage is a so-called "downstream user" and "producer of articles". According to the REACH Regulation, our products are "articles" and therefore do not itself have to be registered or cannot be registered, since according to the REACH Regulation only certain "substances", possibly contained in articles, have to be registered. Furthermore, as a downstream user and producer of articles we are not obliged to provide safety data sheets for our products.

Article 33(1) of the REACH Regulation obliges us, as well as our suppliers, to inform our customers about the presence of substances from the candidate list of Substances of Very High Concern published by the European Chemicals Agency ("ECHA") in accordance with Art 59(10) of the REACH Regulation ("SVHC List") in the specified concentration (mass fraction > 0.1%).

We can provide you with the following information from the supply chain data known to us so far:

- To our current knowledge (based on information from our suppliers), our current products do not contain any Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC) above 0.1% by mass listed in the SVHC List or extensions thereto until 23 Jan 2024.
- Should our knowledge change and we become aware that one of our products contains Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC) based on the ECHA Candidate List above 0.1% by mass, we will inform you as soon as possible in accordance with Article 33 of the REACH Regulation. We always refer to the currently valid SVHC List.
- We will inform you of relevant modifications to our products prompted by the REACH Regulation, their ability to be supplied as well as the quality of the parts/products supplied by us to you within the scope of our business relationship and, in individual cases, coordinate suitable measures with you.
- Furthermore, as of January 5, 2021, suppliers of articles containing Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC) above 0.1% by mass must submit information on the safe use of the articles to the ECHA, according to the EU Waste Framework Directive no. 2008/98. The SCIP2 database has been established as an exchange platform. Jung Pumpen will comply with regulatory requirements, which may vary depending on Member State implementation. Required information will be provided to ECHA accordingly for affected products.

This declaration has been prepared and issued on the basis of the laws and regulations in force at the present time and to the best of our knowledge and current understanding.
